Schools Attuned is a comprehensive, yearlong professional development program for K-12 educators. The program has three components: pre-course work, a core program of a minimum of 35 instructional hours, and a minimum of 10 hours of follow-up practicum. The curriculum is based on focused study (content) and school based application (process) of the eight neurodevelopment constructs that affect learning. The Children's Health Council provides this workshop in the months of February, June and August.

On Location Schools Attuned Program: For those who wish to host Schools Attuned at their school, we will bring the program to you. Determine dates, location and group size (minimum 15) and we will facilitate the workshop at your site.

On Location Schools Attuned® InPractice Program: The Schools Attuned® program includes 10 hours of topical modules that are typically completed over the school year following attendance at the core course. We offer delivery of the 10 hours of InPractice at your location and provide an array of choices to customize implementation at your school.

Schools Attuned® Awareness Workshops: Our Awareness workshops are designed to provide an overview of the philosophy of Schools Attuned® and an understanding of the components of this Professional Development Program. Several options are available depending on your needs.

Option 1

A thirty-minute or one-hour program designed to provide a brief overview of neurodevelopmental variation as it relates to learning. This option is best suited for a group of teachers or parents who want to explore the possibility of more in-depth training.

Option 2

A one-hour workshop designed to explore additional information about the philosophy, content, process and implementation of the program Schools Attuned®. This option is best suited for a school or district ready to commit to Schools Attuned training.

Option 3

A two-hour plus workshop designed to offer an in-depth overview of Dr Levine's philosophy, the eight neurodevelopmental constructs and a hands-on experience to better understand the role of the constructs and learning. This option is best suited for organizations that want to develop awareness of neurodevelopmental variation and explore specific strategies appropriate for various learning styles.
