



# Spaces are Available in the Esther B. Clark School

The Esther B. Clark (EBC) School is a non-public, therapeutic day school for students with significant emotional, behavioral and learning challenges.

With up to eight full-day classrooms, each designed to accommodate twelve students, the EBC School offers specially designed curricula for students between the ages of eight and sixteen.

Classroom organization and format cater to children with severe social and emotional problems, behavior problems, and mild speech and language or specific learning disabilities.

Depending upon their progress, students are typically enrolled for sixteen to twenty-four months. Students are grouped according to their age, social and educational needs rather than grade level.

The EBC School only accepts students who are special education eligible.

Tuition and other related services such as speech and language therapy, occupational therapy and transportation costs are funded by the school district.

**Private parent referrals are accepted. The referral process is the same as for a district referral.  
Parent referrals are funded by the family.**

Mental health services are generally supported through county mental health agencies.
