2-Part Course Description

This course will prepare mental health clinicians (e.g., MFT, LCSW, PhD, PsyD, MD, NP, etc.) to assess suicide risk among children and adolescents, prepare safety plans with patients and their families, and determine appropriate steps for crisis intervention associated with suicidality and self-harm among young people receiving outpatient mental health care.

Goals & Objectives

1. Screen any child or adolescent for suicidal thoughts in an outpatient setting.
2. Assess suicide risk of any child or adolescent and determine subsequent plan for intervention.
3. Collaboratively design an effective safety plan with the patient and their guardians.
4. Demonstrate knowledge of crisis intervention procedures for children/adolescents at high risk for suicide.

About the Speaker

Katherine Reeves is a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (NP) who works with children, adolescents and their parents to treat psychiatric disorders including anxiety, depression, trauma related disorders, ADHD and behavioral disorders. Katie has experience working in a group home setting as well as in community outreach, homeless adolescent mental health, LGBTQ health and psychiatric emergency services. She has primary responsibility for patients, and she works with other clinicians to oversee the prescription and management of medication, and general medical and mental health.
